OUR VISION

Greater Linden is a community dedicated to equitably shaping its dynamic neighborhoods and building a sense of pride and appreciation of assets among residents.

Greater Linden Neighborhood Leadership Academy will provide participants with the skills necessary to build and maintain relationships, establish and expand collaboration, plan strategically, and cultivate civic engagement.

Upon completion of the program, graduates will use what they have learned to achieve a flourishing neighborhood.

PROGRAM SUMMARY

The Greater Linden Neighborhood Leadership Academy (NLA) is an expansion of the greater Columbus Neighborhood Leadership Academy initially launched by United Way of Central Ohio in 2012. The program is inspired by aspirations of building a diverse, opportunity-rich Greater Linden community that bridges social spheres for a vital and inclusive North, South and East Linden.

With an emphasis on "Stronger Together," this unique Linden leadership program is designed to equip residents with the network and knowledge to collaborate and tools to create change. Participants will aspire to make a positive impact in their neighborhoods by building upon existing assets of their community.

Learning opportunities will be designed such that participants benefit from a good balance of traditional, classroom-based learning with highly-engaging experiential learning opportunities including community tours and field trips.

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PROGRAM SCHEDULE

The Greater Linden NLA requires a commitment of approximately 40 hours (8 leadership sessions) over a period of four (4) months (November - February), and additional work pursuing a community-based, team project designed to propel transformative change in your neighborhood.

Following review of the written application qualified applicants will be contacted for interview/orientation/welcome ceremony session scheduled for Wednesday, November 13, 2019 from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.

Subsequent classes meet on Saturday mornings (10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.) and attendance is required (with project funding contingent of full participation). Classes have been tentatively scheduled for the following dates:

November 23, 2019	January 11, 2020	February 8, 2020
November 30, 2019	January 18, 2020	February 22, 2020
December 7, 2019	February 1, 2020	

Participants will be required to attend one civic or neighborhood group meeting and two group project meetings. Group meeting dates and times vary based upon project selection. Graduation ceremony is scheduled for February 26, 2020 from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.

PARTICIPANT WORKSHOP

Assets Tour of Linden (Bus Tour)

- A multi-stop bus tour, beginning in Milo-Grogan and traveling through North, South, and East Linden, will showcase the community assets in Linden. Sites on the tour include Saraga grocery store and a meal at Darbo, an Italian-Somali restaurant.

Resident Interview

- Participants will first identify a new or long term resident of the Greater Linden community (North, South, or East Linden), and then conduct an interview to capture the personal history of residents in the community.

Learning Linden's History

- Participants will spend time with historian, Doreen Uhas, to review a curated collection of historical documents that summarize the history of Linden. The session will also dedicate time to reflection on participants' experiences from the Asset Tour of Linden and to the brief presentation of Resident Interviews.

One Linden Plan

- Group discussion will be central to a session on the One Linden Plan for the Greater Linden community. An introduction to community planning, explaining the purpose and components, will be provided. Then, participants will be challenged to author their own changes for the Linden community related to one of the 10 Big Ideas.

Shaping the Narrative of Linden:

- Whether soliciting volunteers, funding or support from city council a leader must be able to craft a compelling story. Cindy Gaillard from WOSU public media will provide participants with tips and tools to help shape the narrative of Linden.

City Council Engagement:

- Participants will learn how to engage city council and meet Councilpersons and representatives.

Community Project:

- Participants will discuss potential community projects, vote on a project and plan an action, followed with formal report out presentation.

PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY

Open to any adult (age 18 and older) residing, working or worshipping within the Greater Linden area who aspires to bring positive and productive change to their neighborhoods. Greater Linden is bounded by Weber Road to the north, Woodland Avenue to the east, Bonham Avenue to the south, and the CSX Railroad right-of-way to the west.

PARTICIPANT CRITERIA

Successful candidates will be those who:

- Possess an earnest desire to serve as an agent of change in their neighborhood.
- Believe their communities are already rich with assets and in pursuing positive change, believe building upon these existing assets is the first place to begin.
- Are passionate about building new sets of skills, gaining access to new tools, and building relationships for the purpose of achieving transformative change in their neighborhood.
- Value diversity amongst their neighbors, safety in their community, and a commitment to maintaining the existing fabric of their community.
- Are willing to become a member of the Greater Linden NLA alumni group at the conclusion of the academy to help future emerging leaders successfully complete future academies.
